MISSION STATEMENT

Texas 2100 works to achieve a sovereign Texas through a legal political and social process by the year 2100

To achieve this end, Texas 2100 will:

- Conduct research on the attitudes and beliefs of Texas citizens to determine overall public support for Texas independence
- Collect and analyze data on factors influencing public opinion regarding Texas sovereignty determining strategies for influencing those not in favor of de-annexation
- Develop a grassroots organization of people supporting Texas independence and working through that organization to influence Texas' political leaders toward the required political process to enact a reversal of the February 19, 1845 admission into the United States federation
- Develop a political party that favors Texas' independence aiding individuals willing to use their political authority to enact legislation enabling an official route to Texas de-annexation
- Work to develop critical socio-political processes creating the political impetus to sustain progress toward Texas independence
- Create communications programs that promote Texas sovereignty
- Ensure the legality and legitimacy of a Texas independence movement by educating its members, regulating the tone and accuracy of information, ensuring compliance to organizational protocols, and fostering a positive public opinion of the Association.

About Texas 2100

Texas 2100 is a non-profit membership association composed of people committed to the attainment of Texas independence by the year 2100. The Association works through its members and partnering organizations to promote a process whereby the Government of the State of Texas seeks a political agreement reversing the Annexation of Texas by the United States; creating a bi-lateral framework and agreements necessary for the separation of political and economic relations under the existing federal system; and, developing international relations and treaties whereby Texas functions as a sovereign state recognized by the world member states.

To achieve these ends, the Association: conducts policy and political research related to Texas sovereignty; collects data and information on public sentiment inside and outside Texas; develops information and literature promoting Texas independence; and, works to develop political relationships, processes, and groups necessary to achieve the level of acceptance and political will to ensure Texas political leaders work to obtain the necessary legislative actions required to achieve Texas sovereignty.
